

Dear Friend

I hope you're all well. This is an appeal for help for the survivors of Cyclone Idai in Zimbabwe.

I'm sure you've all heard of the recent devastation of parts of Zimbabwe's eastern highlands (Manicaland Province) caused by Cyclone Idai. The loss of life has been tragic, and for the survivors, the situation is dire. Thousands of poor rural folk have lost their homes, their meager belongings, their few livestock and this season's food crop. Famine, starvation and disease await to claim more victims. We can help mitigate and avert this humanitarian disaster in this beautiful part of Zimbabwe. Every ounce of help matters.

I have successfully asked Medicins Sans Frontiers [MSF] (Doctors Without Borders) Southern Africa in Johannesburg, South Africa, to open an account for donations dedicated to the relief of the survivors of Cyclone Idai in Zimbabwe.

As I spoke to them yesterday, they were already having a team on the ground in Manicaland, doing a needs assessment. I worked with MSF in the early 1990s. They are good at emergency relief work, and they have excellent governance structures. MSF were awarded the 1999 Nobel Peace Prize for their humanitarian crisis relief work, globally.
